



The Merchant Shipping Registration Act 1991

Declaration of Ownership by Transferee, Individual Owner or Joint Owner

1. Please ensure that you complete all three parts of this form.
2. After completion of Part 3, send this form together with the documents specified in that part to Isle of Man Ship Registry.
3. A ship is entitled to be registered if 33 of the 64 shares are legally and beneficially owned by qualified persons (defined in Part 2). Joint owners of a share must all be qualified persons for that share to count towards the 33 shares required.
4. If the vessel is currently registered abroad you must take all reasonable steps to remove the vessel from the foreign register before completing registration under the above Act. Failure to comply with this requirement can result in a fine.

An Isle of Man Resident in the case of an individual is a person residing, that is living and sleeping, in the Isle of Man for a significant part of the year. If a person is resident in the Isle of Man for Tax purposes, they will be regarded as resident for the purposes of the Merchant Shipping Registration Act 1991.

- A qualified person is a citizen/subject/body corporate as defined in the categories below:
- A A British citizen;
 - B A British Dependent Territory citizen;
 - C A British Overseas citizen;
 - D A British citizen under the 1981 Act;
 - E A British National overseas;
 - F A citizen of the Republic of Ireland;
 - G A citizen of the EU or EEA
 - H In addition: Prescribed relevant countries(see RAN 02, no. 3)



As defined Act Within the British Nationality 1981

Joint owners must appoint the same Representative Person and Manager.

A Manager can be an owner, the representative person, or some other individual or body corporate.

The Department must be kept informed of all changes of Representative Person and Manager including changes in name, address and new appointments.
