Withdrawal of Industry Circulars

Ref. 008-16 Issued 01/08/16

The Ship Registry wishes to advise that our current Industry Circulars will be withdrawn, effective from today. This is due to the fact that there is now a significant overlap in the purpose of Industry Circulars and <u>Manx Shipping Notices</u>. Where appropriate, withdrawn Industry Circulars have been replaced by a new or amended Manx Shipping Notice on the same subject, but in most cases the Industry Circulars have been deemed no longer relevant.

The following table advises the status of those Industry Circulars that were in force immediately prior to the issuance of this notice. All other Industry Circulars have previously been withdrawn:
